Gascoyne region

The local government authorities of:
Carnarvon, Exmouth, Shark Bay and Upper Gascoyne.

Goldfields-Esperance region

The local government authorities of:
Coolgardie, Dundas, Esperance, Kalgoorlie-Boulder, Laverton, Leonora, Menzies, Ngaanyatjaraku and Ravensthorpe.

Great Southern region

The local government authorities of:
Albany (City), Broomehill- Tambellup, Cranbrook, Denmark, Gnowangerup, Jerramungup, Katanning, Kent, Kojonup, Plantagenet and Woodanilling.

Kimberley region

The local government authorities of:
Broome, Derby-West Kimberley, Halls Creek and Wyndham-East Kimberley.

Mid West region

The local government authorities of:
Carnamah, Chapman Valley, Coorow, Cue, Greater Geraldton (incl. Geraldton, Greenough and Mullewa), Irwin, Meekatharra, Mingenew, Morawa, Mount Magnet, Murchison, Northampton, Perenjori, Sandstone, Three Springs, Wiluna and Yalgoo.

Peel region

The local government authorities of:
Boddington, Mandurah, Murray, Serpentine-Jarrahdale and Waroona.

Pilbara region

The local government authorities of:
Ashburton, East Pilbara, Port Hedland and Roebourne.

South West region

The local government authorities of:
Augusta-Margaret River, Boyup Brook, Bridgetown-Greenbushes, Bunbury (City), Busselton (City), Capel, Collie, Dardanup, Donnybrook-Balingup, Harvey, Manjimup and Nannup.

Wheatbelt region

The local government authorities of:
Beverley, Brookton, Bruce Rock, Chittering, Corrigin, Cuballing, Cunderdin, Dalwallinu, Dandaragan, Dowerin, Dumbleyung, Gingin, Goomalling, Kellerberrin, Kondinin, Koorda, Kulin, Lake Grace, Merredin, Moora, Mount Marshall, Mukinbudin, Narembeen, Narrogin (Town), Narrogin (Shire), Northam, Nungarin, Pingelly, Quairading, Tammin, Toodyay, Trayning, Victoria Plains, Wagin, Wandering, West Arthur, Westonia, Wickpin, Williams, Wongan-Ballidu, Wyalkatchem, Yilgarn and York.
