#### COVER PICTURE

The Salmon Gum (*Eucalyptus salmonophloia*) is found over a large tract of country eastward of a line from Mullewa in the north, through Carnamah, Moora, Brookton and Wagin down to Gnowangerup. Its shining lanceolate leaves and yellowish-pink to almost white bark make it one of our most attractive wheatbelt trees, and its timber is extensively used for mining purposes. The tree attains a height of 75 ft.
